Finished Tote Size 17" x 18³/4" (not including handles)



Shop

Green bat print (tote, lining) 5⁄8 yd. Orange eyes print and black bat print (tote) 3/8 yd. each Orange stripe (tote) 1 fat quarter* Halloween panel (tote front) 1 full panel** Black/orange stripe (handles) 1⁄8 yd. Paper-backed fusible web ³/4 yd. Pellon[®] 987 fusible fleece 1⁄8 yd. *A fat quarter is an 18" x 20-22" cut of fabric. **A full panel in this fabric collection measures approximately 24" x half the width of fabric.

Plan

Your trick-or-treater will be ready to go with this fun Halloween tote featuring the Scribble Monsters II collection by Leeré Aldrich for Clothworks. Quick and simple, this project can be made today for your little monster to use tonight! Following manufacturer's instructions, prepare wrong side of panel with paper-backed fusible web **prior** to cutting strip, square, and rectangle.

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Cut

(in order listed) Green bat print 1 strip 171/2" x 38" 2 strips 11/4" x 171/2" Orange eyes print and black bat print-cut from each: 2 strips 61/2" x 171/2" Orange stripe 1 rectangle 121/2" x 171/2" *Halloween panel 1 strip 43/4" x 121/2", fussy-cut centered on monsters strip 1 square 7" x 7", fussy-cut centered on bats square 1 rectangle 51/2" x 6", fussy-cut centered on black cat rectangle Black/orange stripe 2 strips 21/2" x 20" Pellon® 987 fusible fleece 2 strips 2" x 20" *See Plan before cutting.

Sew

1 Referring to **Diagram I**, stitch together green bat print, orange eyes print, and black bat print 17¹/₂" strips and orange stripe 12¹/₂" x 17¹/₂" rectangle to make pieced strip.

2 Finger-press pieced strip in half on both length and width; use folds and seams as

placement guide. Referring to **Diagram II** and **photos**, position fussy-cut panel strip, square, and rectangle as shown and fuse in place.



Edge-stitch using matching thread and machine satin stitch (**Diagram III**).







3 Referring to **Diagram IV-A**, fold pieced and fused strip in half, right sides together, and stitch both sides to form tote.



fold Diagram IV-A

To make lining, fold green bat $17\frac{1}{2}$ x 38" strip in half, right sides together, and stitch sides leaving opening for turning (**Diagram IV-B**).



4 Insert tote in lining, right sides together and aligning side seams (**Diagram V-A**). Stitch together around top edge of tote/lining.



Turn right side out through opening in lining seam. Hand stitch opening closed. Push lining into tote, aligning seams. Topstitch ½" from top edge of bag (**Diagram V-B**).



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5 Fuse fleece 20" strip to wrong side of black/or-ange stripe 2¹/₂" x 20" strip, centering (Diagram VI-A). Press ¹/₄" to wrong side of both long edges of handle strip, enclosing fleece edges. Press fused strip in half lengthwise.

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

Stitch close to both long sides (**Diagram VI-B**). Add 3 more lines of stitching, evenly spaced, to complete handle. Make 2.



6 Referring to **Diagram VII**, fold handle ends under ³/₄" and position handle on tote, centering as shown. To secure, topstitch handle ¹/₈" below edge of bag, ¹/₄" below edge of bag, and ¹/₈" above fold of handle ends. Repeat with remaining handle.


