MATERIALS

PROJECT RATING: INTERMEDIATE
Size: 12" x 38½"

- ½ yard white solid for background
- 5 fat eighths* assorted prints in pink, blue, green, purple, and yellow for wedges and pieced borders
- 1 fat quarter** pink print for triangles
- 1 fat eighth* green print for borders

¼ yard blue print for binding ½ yard backing fabric Craft-size quilt batting

- *fat eighth = 9" x 20"
- $\star\star$ fat quarter = 18" x 20"

Cutting

Measurements include ¼" seam allowances. Border strips are exact length needed. You may want to make them longer to allow for piecing variations. Pattern for Wedge is on page 2.

From white solid, cut:

- 1 (12½"-wide) strip. From strip, cut 1 (12½" x 18½") background A rectangle.
- 1 (4¼"-wide) strip. From strip, cut 3 (4¼") squares and 4 (2¾") squares. Cut 4¼" squares in half diagonally in both directions to make 12 quarter-square C triangles. Cut 2¾" squares in half diagonally to make 8 half-square D triangles.

From fat eighths, cut a total of:

- 10 Wedges.
- 8 (25/8") B squares.

From pink print fat quarter, cut:

• 1 (93/8"-wide) strip. From strip, cut 1 (93/8") square. Cut square in half diagonally to make 2 half-square E triangles.

From green print fat eighth, cut:

• 4 (1½"-wide) strips. From strips, cut 4 (1½" x 12½") rectangles.

From blue print, cut:

• 3 (21/4"-wide) strips for binding.

Table Runner Center Assembly

1. Fold 1 Wedge in half lengthwise, right sides facing. Stitch across top as shown in *Stitching Diagram*. Trim corner.



2. Open seam and turn point right side out. Press, centering seam as shown in *Wedge Diagram*. Make 10 Wedges.

3. Join 5 Wedges as shown in *Fan Diagram*. Make 2 Fans.



Fan Diagram




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- **4.** Place Fans wrong side up and press seams open, being careful not to stretch fabric.
- **5.** Referring to *Table Runner Assembly Diagram*, center Fans on white background rectangle, pin in place. Appliqué Fans on rectangle turning under curved edge and sides, to complete table runner center.

Pieced Border Assembly

1. Lay out 4 print B squares, 6 white solid C triangles, and 4 white solid D triangles as shown in *Border Diagrams*.

2. Join into diagonal rows; join rows to complete 1 pieced border. Make 2 pieced borders.

Quilt Assembly


- **1.** Lay out table runner center, green print rectangles, pieced borders, and pink print E triangles as shown in *Table Runner Assembly Diagram*.
- **2.** Join to complete table runner.

Finishing

1. Layer backing, batting, and table runner top; baste. Quilt as desired. Quilt shown was quilted with allover swirls

and loops (Quilting Diagram).

2. Join 2¼"-wide blue print strips into 1 continuous piece for straight-grain French-fold binding. Add binding to quilt.
