# trees 

## MATERIALS

Size: $41^{1 ⁄ 21} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 60^{1 / 2 "}$
Blocks: 20 (7" x 8½")
Tree blocks

20 ( $71 / 22^{\prime \prime} \times 9{ }^{\prime \prime}$ ) rectangles assorted prints for block background "sky" 40 (6") squares assorted prints for block background "ground" $1 / 2$ yard brown print for tree trunks $3 / 8$ yard green print for leaves $13 / 4$ yards blue print for sashing, border, and binding Paper-backed fusible web 23/4 yards backing fabric Crib-size quilt batting

## Cutting

Measurements include $1 / 4$ " seam allowances. Border strips are exact length needed. You may want to make them longer to allow for piecing variations. Patterns for appliqué shapes are on page 3 . Follow manufacturer's instructions for using fusible web.

From each of 20 (6") squares, cut:

- 1 A.

From remaining (6") squares, cut:

- 1 B.


## From brown print, cut:

- 20 Tree Trunks.

From green print, cut:

- 114 Leaves.


## From blue print, cut:

- 1 ( $5^{1 / 2}$-wide) lengthwise strip. From strip, cut 1 ( $5^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 42^{\prime \prime}$ ) bottom border.
- $2\left(3^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}\right.$-wide) lengthwise strips. From strips, cut 2 ( $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 53$ ") side borders.
- 6 ( $3^{\prime \prime}$-wide) lengthwise strips. From strips, cut 1 ( $3^{\prime \prime} \times 42^{\prime \prime}$ ) top border, 4 ( $3^{\prime \prime} \times 36^{\prime \prime}$ ) horizontal sashing rectangles and 15 ( 3 " x 9") vertical sashing rectangles.
- 4 ( $2 \frac{1}{4}$ " -wide) lengthwise strips for binding.


## Block Assembly

1. Make 20 Tree blocks.

Quilt Assembly

1. Lay out Tree blocks and sashing rectangles as shown in Quilt Top Assembly Diagram on page 2. Join into rows; join rows to complete quilt center.
2. Add blue print side borders to quilt center. Add top and bottom borders to quilt.

## Finishing

1. Divide backing into 2 ( $13 / 8$-yard) lengths. Cut 1 piece in half lengthwise to make 2 narrow panels. Join 1 narrow panel to wider panel. Seams will run horizontally. Remaining panel is extra and can be used to make a hanging sleeve.
2. Layer backing, batting, and quilt top; baste. Quilt as desired (Quilting Diagram on page 2).
3. Join $21 / 4$ "-wide blue print strips into 1 continuous piece for straight-grain French-fold binding. Add binding to quilt.

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Patterns are shown full size and are reversed for use with fusible web. Add $3 / 16^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowance for hand appliqué.
