# Web Bonus: It's a Hootie Owl Potholder

#### SKILL LEVEL **BEGINNER**

**Note:** Appliqué templates (at end of pattern) are printed without seam allowance, except for straight edge of Template A.

#### Finished Potholder Size 63/4" x 63/4"

### **Fabric Requirements**

Blue batik print (front,

back, hanging loop) 1 fat eighth\* Yellow batik print (wings) 8" x 8" piece Orange batik print (beak) 2" x 2" piece Red batik print (eyes) 6" x 9" piece White solid (eyes) 4" x 7" piece Black mottle (eyes) 3" x 6" piece 9" x 9" piece each Batting and Insul-Bright® Paper-backed fusible web 1/4 yd.

\*A fat eighth is a 9" x 20-22" cut of fabric.

#### **Planning**

This cute potholder, featuring Tonga Confetti Batiks by Timeless Treasures Fabrics, is sure to please the young and the young at heart. Bea used a fusible web appliqué technique; our instructions have you do the same. A layer of Insul-Bright®, an insulating material from The Warm™ Company, is included to make the potholder heat-resistant.

#### **Cutting Instructions**

Note: Cutting instructions for appliqué shapes are on templates at end of pattern.


Blue batik print

2 squares 71/4" x 71/4"

1 strip 2" x 6"

Batting and Insul-Bright—cut from each:

1 square 71/4" x 71/4"




The coordinating 45¾" square quilt is patterned in the September/ October 2012 issue of McCall's Quilting.

## **Appliquéing the Block**

1 Follow manufacturer's instructions for paper-backed fusible web. Trace Templates A-E on paper side of fusible web. Cut apart, leaving small margin beyond drawn lines. Fuse to wrong side of appropriate fabrics; cut out on drawn lines.

Finger-press blue batik print 71/4" square in half on both length and width; use folds as placement guide. Position A-E in alphabetical order, aligning straight edges of As with raw edges of square (Diagram I-A). Fuse in place. Edge-stitch using machine blanket stitch (Diagram I-B) to complete Owl Block.







## **Assembling the Potholder**


2 To make hanging loop, press blue 2" x 6" strip in half lengthwise, wrong sides together (Diagram II-A). Fold long raw edges to meet at pressed line; press again (Diagram II-B). Stitch close to pressed edges, through all layers (Diagram II-C).







Referring to Diagram III-A, layer Insul-Bright, batting, and blue batik 71/4" squares. Fold hanging loop in half and position at top center of blue square (potholder back). Baste or pin ends in place.

## **Designer Information**

4 Place block right side down on layered squares, keeping hanging loop between blue square and block (Diagram III-B). Sew 1/4" seam around all sides, leaving an opening for turning (Diagram III-C). Trim corners, turn right side out, and press well (Diagram III-D). Topstitch close to pressed edges through all layers to complete potholder.
