

# Web Bonus: Liberty Starshine Table Runner

18½" x 54½"

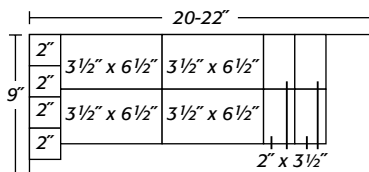
**Number of Blocks and Finished Size**  
4 Liberty Star Blocks 12" x 12"



## Planning

Civil War reproduction prints are great for this rustic, patriotic table runner.

To orient stripes as shown in photo, watch stripe orientation during cutting and piecing. Cut the beige stripe 3½" x 6½" rectangles so that the stripe runs parallel to the 3½" edge. If using navy scraps from your stash, keep in mind that a fat eighth (a 9" x 20-22" cut of fabric) is needed for one block (see **Cutting Diagram**, below). Use an accurate ¼" seam allowance throughout.

## Fabric Requirements

Red/tan print (block corners, piecing)	¾ yd.
Beige/blue stripe (blocks, piecing)	¾ yd.
*Assorted navy prints (blocks)	½-¾ yd.
Gold print (stars)	<b>total</b> 1 fat quarter**
Burgundy print (side strips)	½ yd.
Navy print (binding)	½ yd.
Backing	1⅞ yds.
Batting size	26" x 62"

\*See **Planning**.  
\*\*A fat quarter is an 18" x 20-22" cut of fabric.

## Cutting Instructions (cut in order listed)

Red/tan print  
8 squares 3⅞" x 3⅞"  
8 squares 3½" x 3½"

Beige/blue stripe  
8 squares 3⅞" x 3⅞"  
\*10 rectangles 3½" x 6½"  
32 squares 3½" x 3½"

Assorted navy prints—**cut 4 matched sets of:**  
4 rectangles 3½" x 6½"  
4 rectangles 2" x 3½"  
4 squares 2" x 2"

Gold print  
4 squares 3½" x 3½"  
32 squares 2" x 2"

Burgundy print  
10 rectangles 3½" x 6½"  
16 squares 3½" x 3½"

Navy print  
5 strips 2½" x width of fabric (WOF) for binding

Backing  
2 rectangles 26" x WOF

### Piecing the Blocks and Units

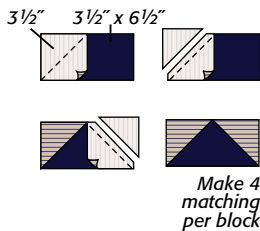
**Note:** Watch orientation of stripes throughout.

**1** Draw diagonal line on wrong side of beige/blue stripe  $3\frac{7}{8}$ " square. Referring to **Diagram I**, place marked square on red/tan print  $3\frac{7}{8}$ " square, right sides together. Sew  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam on each side of marked line; cut apart on marked line. Open and press to make 2 pieced squares. Make 16.

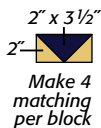


**Diagram I**

**2** Draw diagonal line on wrong side of stripe  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Place marked square on assorted navy print  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle, right sides together, aligning raw edges (**Diagram II-A**). Sew on marked line; trim away and discard excess fabric. Repeat on opposite end to make navy/stripe unit. Make 4 sets of 4 matching. In similar manner, use gold  $2$ " squares and navy  $2$ " x  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle to make star-point unit (**Diagram II-B**). Make 4 sets of 4 matching.

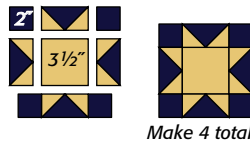

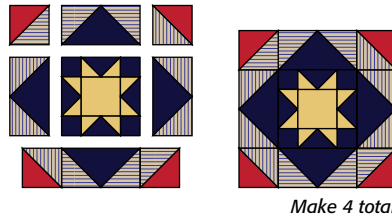

**3** Referring to **Diagram III-A**, sew together 4 matching navy  $2$ " squares, 4 matching star-point units, and gold  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square to make star. Sew together 4 pieced squares, 4 matching navy/beige units, and star to make Liberty Star Block (**Diagram III-B**). Make 4 total.

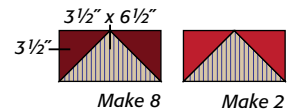

**4** Referring to Step 2 technique, make 8 burgundy/stripe units and 2 red/stripe units (**Diagram IV**).

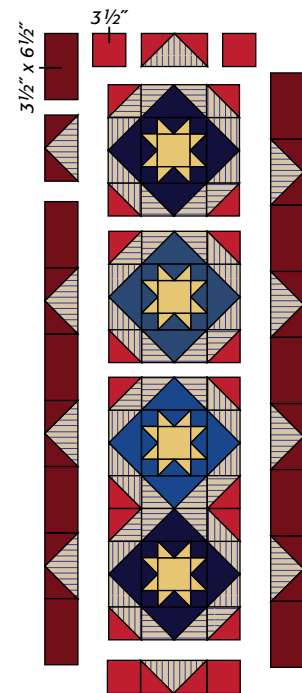
### Assembling the Quilt Top

**Note:** Refer to **Assembly Diagram** for following steps, watching placement and orientation.

**5** Join 5 burgundy  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles and 4 burgundy/stripe units to make side strip. Make 2.

**6** Sew 4 blocks together. Stitch red  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares to ends of 2 red/stripe units; sew to top and bottom to complete block row.

**7** Sew strips and row together as shown.

### Quilting and Finishing

**8** Sew 2 backing fabric  $26$ " x WOF rectangles together along short sides to make backing. Layer, baste, and quilt. Bind with navy print.
